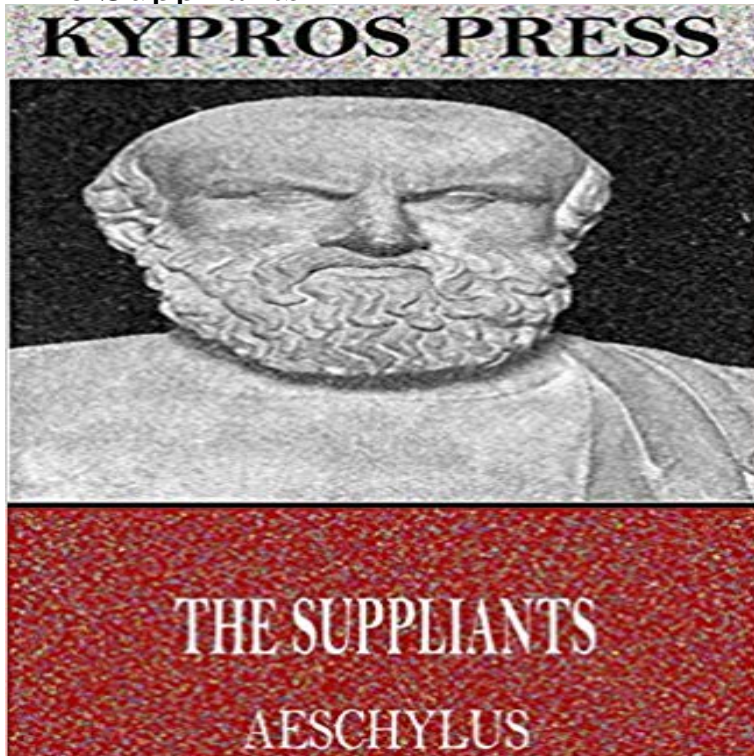


The Suppliants
