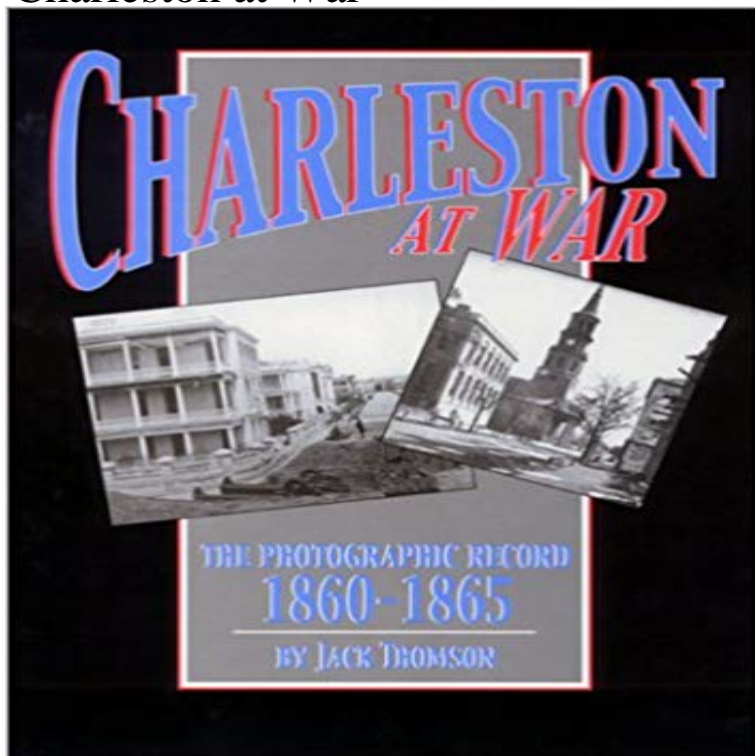


Charleston at War
