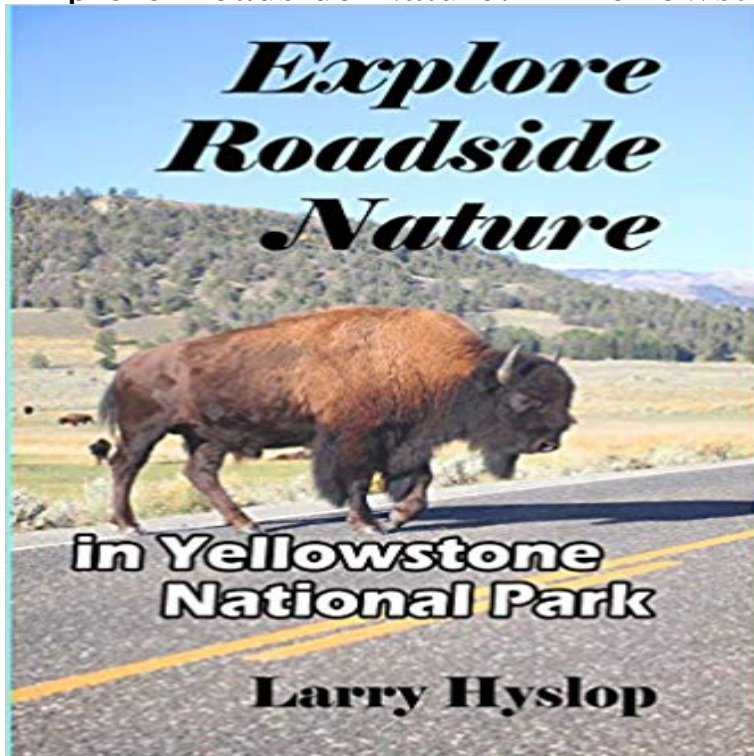


## Explore Roadside Nature: in Yellowstone National Park
