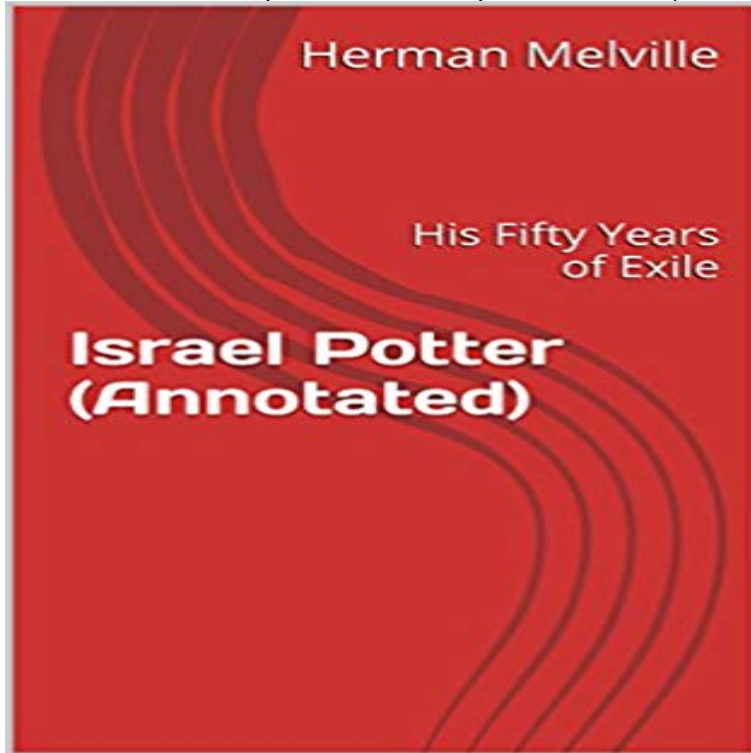


Israel Potter (Annotated): His Fifty Years of Exile

Israel Potter: His Fifty Years of Exile is the eighth book by American writer Herman Melville, first published in serial form in Putnam's Monthly magazine between July 1854 and March 1855, and in book form by G. P. Putnam & Co. in March 1855. Israel Potter (1754-1826) was a real person born in Cranston, Rhode Island. According to his own account, a memoir titled *The Life and Remarkable Adventures of Israel R. Potter* (published 1824), he had been a veteran of the Battle of Bunker Hill, a sailor in the Revolutionary navy, a prisoner of the British, an escapee in England, a secret agent and courier in France, and a 45-year exile from his native land as a laborer, pauper, and peddler in London. Melville's plot combines a number of Potter's actual encounters with King George III, Horne Tooke, and Benjamin Franklin with some he never had with Ethan Allen and John Paul Jones.
