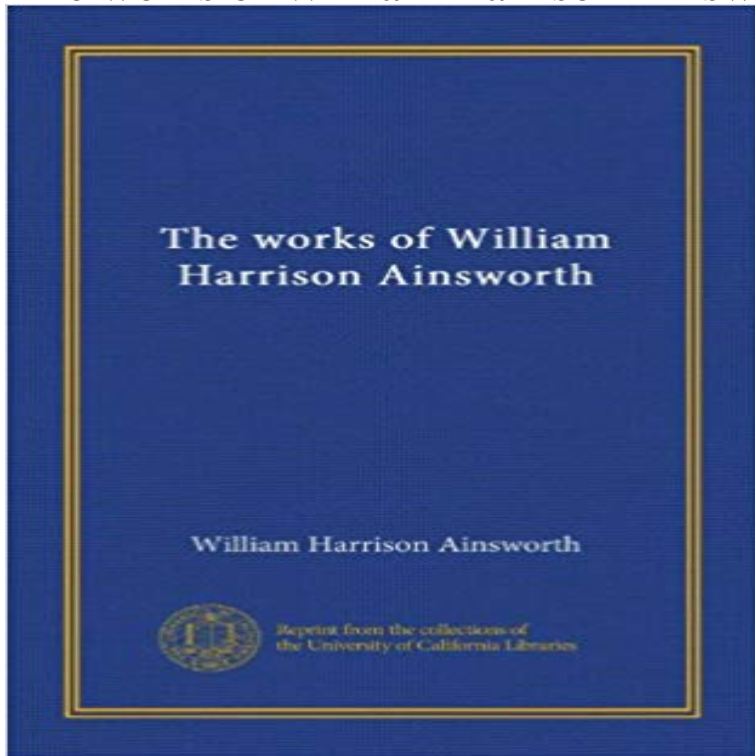


The works of William Harrison Ainsworth (v.2)
