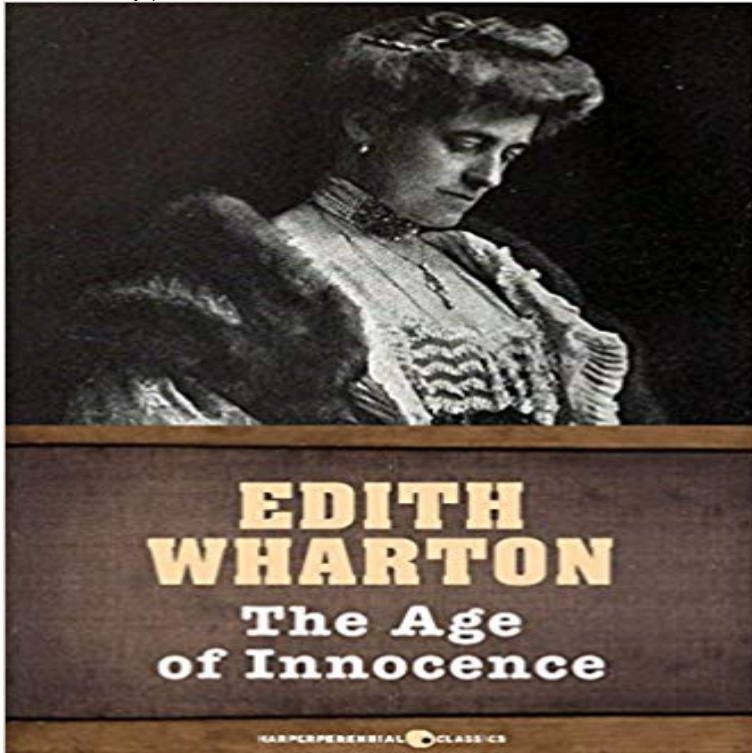


The Age Of Innocence
