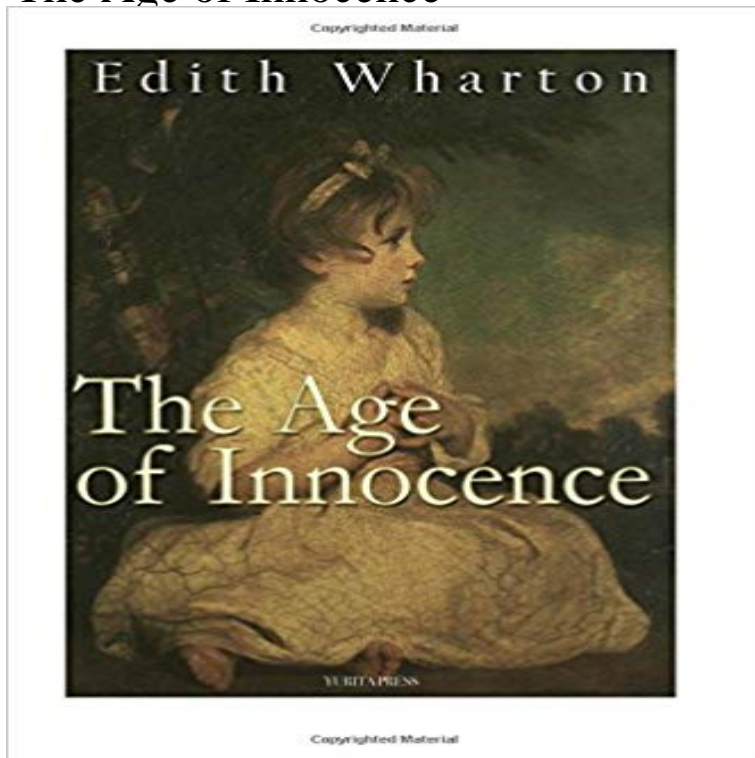


The Age of Innocence



In 1921, Edith Wharton became the first woman to win a Pulitzer Prize, earning the award for *The Age of Innocence*.
