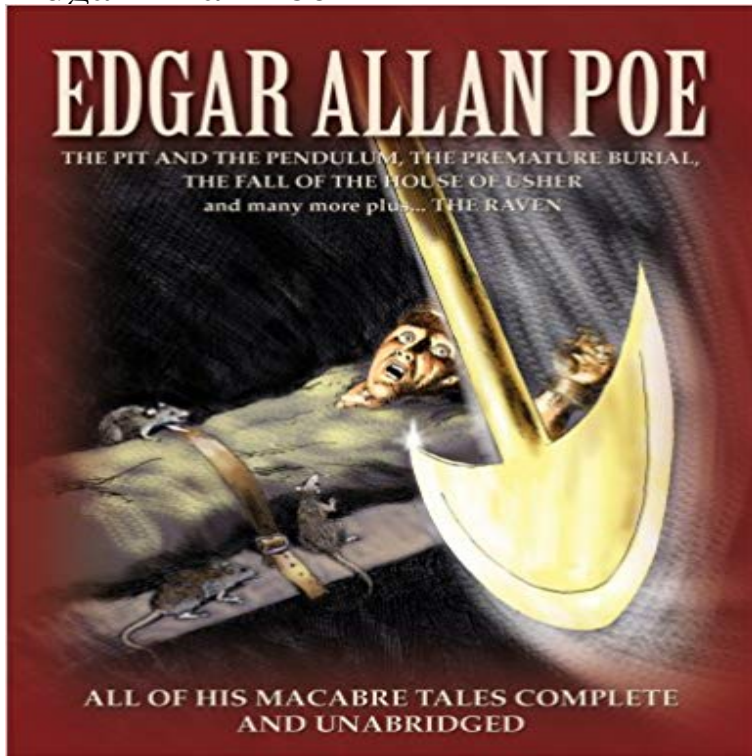


Edgar Allan Poe
