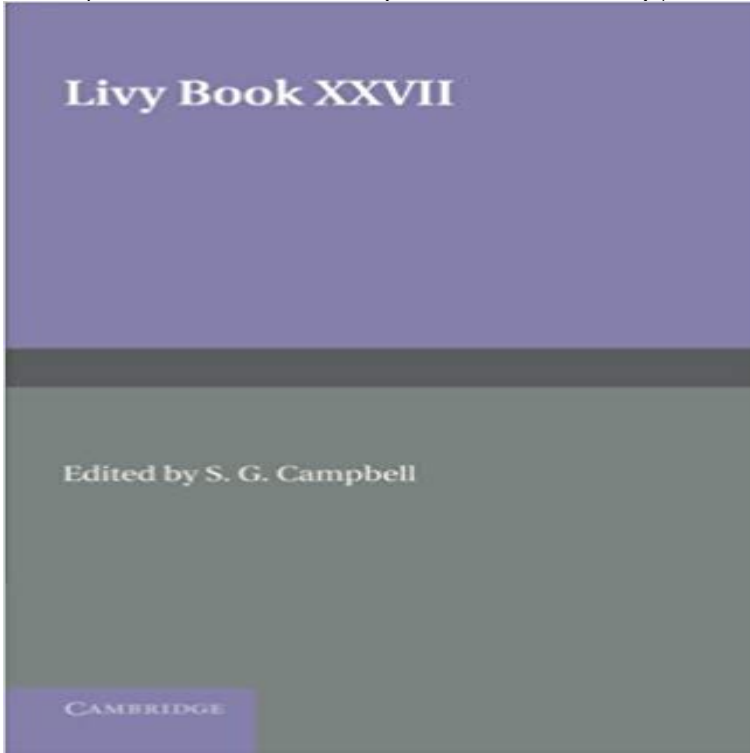


Livy Book XXVII (Latin and English Edition)

The history is prefaced with an introduction to Livy's sources and a guide to his dense style, a thorough commentary on the text and a vocabulary list. This book will be of value to anyone with an interest in Livy or the history of the wars between Carthage and Rome.
