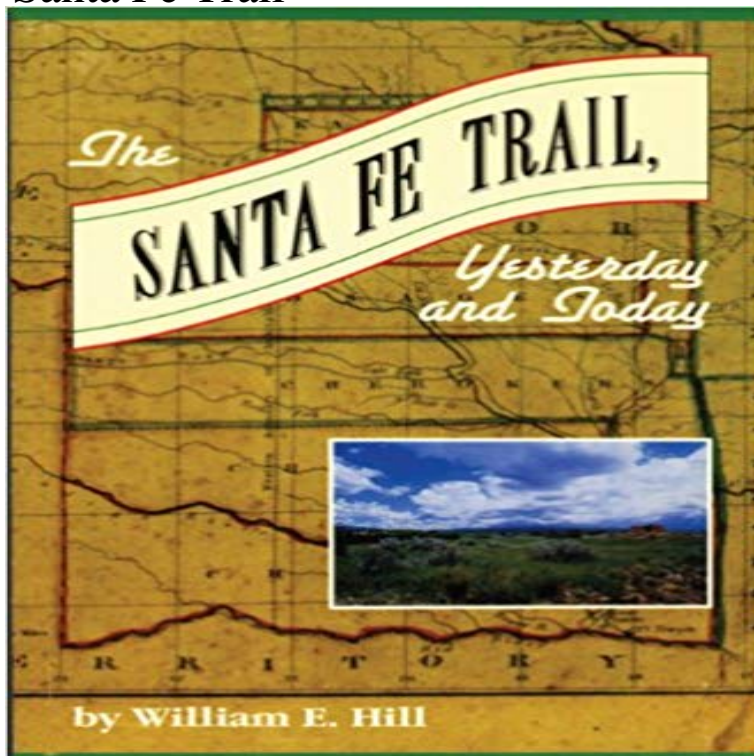


Santa Fe Trail
